#### COMMUNIQUE FROM THE 67<sup>th</sup> DLCO-EA REGULAR COUNCIL OF MINISTERS MEETING HELD AT SPEKE RESORT MUNYONYO, KAMPALA, UGANDA 27<sup>TH</sup> - 28<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2022

# THE ORGANIZATION

The Desert Locust Control Organization for Eastern Africa (DLCO-EA) is a Regional pest and vector management Organization **established in 1962** with its Headquarters located in **Addis Ababa, Ethiopia** and Control Reserve Bases (CRBs) in the Member Countries. The Member Countries are **Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, South Sudan, Sudan, Tanzania** and **Uganda**.

#### MANDATE

The Organization is mandated to enhance **Food Security** in the Eastern Africa Region by conducting research, monitoring and forecasting, implementing control operations against mandated **Migratory pest occurrences** viz: Desert Locusts, African Armyworms, Grain eating Quelea birds and Tsetse flies.

#### THE 67<sup>th</sup> DLCO-EA GOVERNING COUNCIL OF MINISTERS SESSION

The Governing Council made up of the Cabinet Ministers responsible for Agriculture in the respective Member Countries convened in Kampala from  $27^{\text{th}} - 28^{\text{th}}$  October, 2022 to address **food security** challenges by taking up measures to control the migratory pests.

The Council received, discussed and approved the financial proposals and work plans of the Organization for the Financial Year 2022/2023.

## RESOLUTIONS

## The Council

- 1. **APPRECIATED** the hospitality and cordial reception accorded by the Host Country under the able leadership of the President, His Excellency Yoweri Kaguta Museveni.
- 2. **RECOGNIZED** and **CONGRATULATED** the Federal Republic of Somalia for peacefully concluding the recent Presidential Election in 2022.

- 3. **RECOGNIZED** and **CONGRATULATED** the Republic of Kenya for peacefully concluding the recent General Elections in 2022.
- 4. **NOTED** that Agriculture is the backbone of the economies of the Member Countries and that **food security** is of major concern to all the respective Member Countries.
- 5. **REITERATED** the importance of ensuring food and nutrition security as a basis for healthy populations and appreciated the contribution of Agriculture towards **poverty alleviation**.
- **6. RECOGNIZED** the need to have a platform of the Heads of State of the Member Countries to provide strategic direction to the Organization.
- 7. **RECOGNIZED** the need to revamp all the Control Reserve Bases in the Member Countries for sustainability of the Organization.
- **8. RECOGNIZED** the need to transform and modernize the operations of the Organization taking into consideration of the Information and Technology era of Artificial Intelligence.
- 9. **RECOGNIZED** that migratory and other pests of economic importance can contribute to losses up to **100%** of potential agricultural production if not managed in a timely manner.
- 10. **RECOGNIZED** the seriousness of other emerging migratory pests in the region.
- 11. **RECOGNIZED** the need to review and update the DLCO-EA Convention in order to be able to address the current and emerging challenges of migratory pests in the region.
- 12. **RECOGNIZED** the **financial challenges** facing the Organization and urged Member Countries to honour the committed Annual contributions and Arrears to enable DLCO-EA offer better services to the Member Countries.
- 13. **RECOGNIZED** the need to pay a courtesy call to H.E. the President of the Republic of Uganda for strategic guidance; upon which he recommended the following
  - a) Escalate the policy organ of DLCO-EA to IGAD by formulating IGAD plus.
  - b) Payment of arrears by all Member Countries
  - c) Initiate reforms to modernise the organization so that it responds to the current and emerging challenges.
  - d) Develop a strategy for preemptive action at the source in the operations of the organization
  - e) To follow up with his counterpart Heads of State on the above.

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In appreciation of all the above:

- i) The Council **DIRECTED** Management to mobilize funds from both the Member Countries and Development Partners among others to finance the Organization.
- ii) The Ministers further **COMMITED** their respective Governments to support the activities of the Organization through timely payment of the **annual contributions and arrears**.
- iii) The Council **AGREED** to hold its next **(68<sup>th</sup>)** DLCO-EA Executive and Council Regular Sessions in Tanzania in September, 2023 under the Chairmanship of Somalia.
